

Menna is an 18 year old Paralympic skier in Team GB. She has less than 5% vision and is guided down the mountain by her guide. Inspiring?

Well add to that in her first season competing at World Cup level, she not only joined midway through the winter season but she and her guide, Jennifer Kehoe, made history at the IPC (International Paralympic Committee) World Cup in Aspen (USA) at the end of February 2016 by becoming the first British skiers to win the overall World Cup Visually

Impaired title.



Menna teamed up with her auide Jennifer Kehoe after aettina back involved in ski racina last summer having been invited to train with the Wales Ski Team and Welsh based club Dragons Alpine. Menna achieved

some great results while being supported by the Disability Sport Wales Academy programme which gained her qualification for the World Cup programme. In March 2017 Menna won 2 Gold Medals at the Slalom and Giant Slalom events France She will be competing in Chile. Norway and Germany later in the year hefore taking part in her first Paralympics in South Korea in 2018



Menna trains around the world for most of the year but when she is home she visits schools and brownie units to give talks for free on disability awareness and to encourage them to do whatever makes them happy and not feel restricted. She also visits other visually impaired children and takes her medals and trophies so they can feel them and feel inspired. She is truly an inspiration to all those she meets

Recognising women in business whose talents and passion influence and inspire others

Diane Berry

Diane's design career started in her early teens when she was sent off to her Dad's design studio to clean for pocket money. The job was a chore but started a passion for design. Diane joined the family business starting with the basics – yes cleaning again, but learnt valuable lessons from the designers and trades people around her. After a successful career working for others, Diane set up her own business in 2011 following a life changing illness. Starting with three people, the business has grown to a team of fourteen, winning more design and business awards than any other kitchen business in the UK.

In 2016, Diane Beery won their first International Design Award, and in a three-week period also won the famous Black "D" Award for Best Ultimate Luxury Kitchen Design and the Best Northern Kitchen Design Award.

Brenda Burling and Julie Mannering

Sisters Brenda Burling and Julie Mannering set up their very first day nursery in Latchford, Warrington nearly two decades ago., adding new sites over the years and winning Awards along the way, with 85 percent of the Group's registered nurseries rated 'Outstanding' by the Office for Standards in Education, Children's Services and Skills (Ofsted).

The Group operates an inclusive policy for children with disabilities and stepped forward to deliver care to a child with feeding tubes who had been turned down by multiple other settings. They were among the first to embrace Forest School's outdoor approach to education and play. They have invested in landscaping the grounds of their settings to support this style of hands-on, naturalistic teaching, where the focus is on developing personal, social and emotional life skills through learner-led, nature-based learning.

Maggie Noone

Maggie Noone is the Sales Director of R Noone and Son Ltd, a fresh produce distribution company based in Bredbury, Stockport. She's not always been in veg however, with a successful career in pharmaceutical sales and an arts background before that.

Maggie joined Noones, her husband Mike's business back then, at the point where the high street collapsed and the four adored and busy shops looked to be in trouble. Part time sales person, full time medical rep and full time Mum of three she simply grabbed the phone book and went from there. Joining full time 12 years ago, the business now proudly supplies over 650 customers with 95 members of staff. Maggie and Mike won the MFDF's Lifetime Contribution award two years ago (which they still can't believe) and we know our wonderful customers had a lot to do with that nomination.

Recognising women whose contributions to society make a substantial difference to the lives of others

Saira Choudhry

Saira attended college when her daughter, Leah was 1 year old & then when Leah was 3, Saira went to university to study for a TV & Radio Degree. She landed the part of Anita Roy in Ghannel 4's Hollyoaks where she played a teenager, tackling storylines such as racism & bullying. She began getting a lot of teenagers messaging her for advice on these topics and also asking how she became an actress.

Realising that there were lots of children/teens with a dream and no idea to go about it, she hired a local hall and started an acting class, TV Talent. The ethos at TV Talent is - Creating Confident Kids. The aim is selling confidence not acting classes, Within 3 years there are around 270 attending across 5 yenues in Manchester.

Audrey Davies

Audrey created and still leads Friends of Harmers Wood Trust Ltd in 2005 after discovering that a nine acre wood used by dog walkers in Helsby, had been put up for sale by Cholmondeley Estate and was at risk of being bought for commercial activities. The woodland also contained four historic, sandstone quarries dating back to 1830's for stone to be used in constructing a number of local buildings including St Paul's Church in the village.

After 2 years of campaigning, creating a new charity and putting together a safety plan and grant application to the National Lottery the land was acquired on behalf of the local community with a covenant to protect the land in perpetuity. Each year thousands of people now use the woods to walk their dogs, run, ramble and rock climb (in the quarries).

Dee Drake

In 2016 the Lalley Toy Appeal was able to provide a Christmas sack of toys to 1,900 children in the Manchester and Cheshire area. Each toy sack is made specifically for each child, based on their age, gender and any special needs they may have.

The powerhouse behind the Appeal is Dee Drake. She works tirelessly throughout the year, counting toys in storage, fund raising and thinking of ways to help the under privileged.

The Lalley is based in Levenshulme one of the poorest parts of Manchester and Dee made it onto the TV in 2015, as part of a documentary: 'At the Lalley', alongside Sister Rita also known as Atilla the Nun. Ay the end of 2016, Dee was asked if she was aiming for 2000 toy sacks in 2017? Her answer? No. I'm doubling it, 4000....

Aisha Latif

Aisha Latif

A Graduate in Biomedical Sciences, Aisha started her own cosmetic business 3 years ago As a teenager she always struggled to find the correct products for acne and hyperpigmentation, leading to self-confidence issues. Difficulties whilst on Maternity leave led to Aisha feeling broken. She decided to take a short Make-Up artistry course to help overcome her anxiety. Whilst consulting she found a gap in the market, travelling the world to find a group of chemists who she could work with to formulate products of highest level of purity and quality as well, vegan, cruelty free and EU regulated.

Ash Cosmetics products are now recognised within the Film, fashion and media industry, winning the Best Beauty Product Award for 2017 from Fashion and Beauty awards UK. Aisha is Mum to 3 babies under the age of 5 and still working in Research full time whilst working late nights to make this

dream come a reality.

Diane Murphy

Diane's change of career has been pretty dramatic. This former Police Officer who followed England around Europe as the first and only female Football hooligan spotter which meant mixing with the fans in plain clothes, decided to trade it all in after a trip to America. She was inspired to set up a bakery for dogs and cats after the online version took off, finally leaving the force in 2016 after working part-time on the business for two years.

At Millie & Rubys Dog Bakery they produce handmade natural dog biscuits and cakes that are free from additives, preservatives, sugar, salt & colourings for dogs and cats. They also use ingredients that are organic and sourced locally where possible and they aim to make most of the treats as low fat as possible.

Melissa Timperley

The 24 year-old international hair stylist opened her first salon in Manchester's trendy Northern Quarter in December 2016. Already recognised as a rising star in the profession; in 2016 she was a member of the four-strong Fellowship for British Hairdressing F.A.M.E. Team, which delivers hair styling presentations at major shows in the UK and around the world and a finalist in the internationally recognised IT Girl Awards run by Creative Head and a finalist in the British Hairdressing Awards Newcomer of the Year run by Hairdressers Journal.

The Melissa Timperley three storey newly built detached salon is already being considered for architectural awards for its state of the art approach to design. Not all plain sailing, Melissa admitted here had been times when her leap of faith has been more like a chasm.
