WOMEN MAKING WAVES FINALISTS

This award seeks to recognise women's contributions worldwide in community, sustainability, education or business.

ALICE HENDY



In November 2020, Alice lost her 2I year old brother, Josh, to suicide. When she examined the search history on his mobile phone and laptop, it was evident that Josh had been researching ways to end his life by

visiting certain sites online.

It was after this personal tragedy that Alice came up with the idea of R;pple, a browser extension which can be downloaded onto computers and laptops and has become a mental health and suicide prevention campaigner.

Once downloaded, if an individual is searching online for harmful material relating to self-harm or suicide, their search will be interrupted. Instead of reaching potentially harmful sites, the user will be presented with a message of hope followed by a short breathing exercise, before being signposted to one of the many mental health resources that can give them help and hope.

BASARAT KAZIM



Pakistan is one of the lowest-performing countries in the Southeast Asian region in terms of access to primary education, its quality, and learning outcomes, with an estimated 22.8 million

children aged 5-16 not attending school.

For over 40 years, Basarat has been at the forefront of tackling these problems bringing meaningful education and literacy initiatives to vulnerable communities in Pakistan. All done through the Alif Laila Book Bus Society (ALBBS), which transforms spaces like parks, community centres, public spaces and classrooms into learning spaces.

Since 2020, 1017 box libraries have been set up in the form of 17 unique mobile libraries in the form of camels, rickshaws, bicycles, motor-bikes, pick-up vans, and yaks running in the most difficult terrains and urban slums of the country. This initiative has covered over 50 districts and benefited over 160,000 children.

NANA ADJOA A. SIFA



Nana is a Ghanaian Social Entrepreneur helping female Agribusiness founders and women farmers to make impact. She is currently the President of Direct Impact Foundation (an organisation

that seeks to bridge the wide gap between rural and urban education) and the initiator of Guzakuza, a social enterprise that empowers young women to create jobs, wealth and food security.

Through Guzakuza, she has inspired and nurtured over 7,000 young women from 30 countries to build game-changing Agribusinesses in Africa.

The 'Ignite' programme, which she leads, is bringing female Agribusiness founders together from across the African continent and helping the displaced to be equipped to build resilient Agribusinesses.

VIV BARCLAY

Our guest speaker for the 31st annual Inspiring Women Awards is 59 year old Viv Barclay, who is attempting to set a world record as the oldest solo woman to row the Atlantic. Oh and let's add that she is not a rower...

"Around 2016, I watched The Yorkshire Rows, four ladies in their 40's and 50's, compete in the Atlantic Challenge and was utterly inspired by them.

At this point in my life, I had become less than I wanted for myself. It was a combination of school run, working and caring for elderly parents with little focus on my own desires. I had been helping my dad to care for my mother, who had Alzheimer's, until her death in 2017.

At that time, menopause was really in full swing and I retreated into myself and stopped engaging with the world. Since then, I've been 'staying small' and going largely unnoticed running my little beeswax wraps business at the same time as continuing to care for my now 92-year-old father.

With my daughter going to Uni, I knew I had a choice to make.

Was I going to sit on the sofa, with a glass of red watching Netflix for the rest of my life (fine for those who want to, I'm not knocking it) or am I going to actually DO something?

I knew I wanted more for myself than the sofa, an adventure that really pushed me and so, with no rowing experience, I signed up for the 2023 Atlantic Challenge, inspired by those Yorkshire Rows back in 2016.

I'm not from a sailing or rowing background, however, many participants are as inexperienced as me and train specifically for this adventure.

The race rules stipulate mandatory training in navigation, sea survival and first aid and I have to complete a minimum number of hours of training rows beforehand. On the start line there will be inspections and I will have to know what everything is for, how it works and how to fix it should an issue occur otherwise I won't be allowed to begin the challenge. Their main priority is safety and they take it extremely seriously.

Am I mad?

Well, you will find out today! I look forward to your questions.

ALISHA MAINI



Alisha (right) is currently reading Medicine at the University of Leeds and due to graduate in July 2023. During her studies, Alisha has undertaken a clinical elective in Infectious Diseases

and Neurology at Hospital de Resturacao, Recife, Brazil and from 2018, has acted as an online tutor in university admission tests including, A-level Biology and Chemistry, GCSE Mathematics and Science

She is passionate about widening access to medical school (WAMS) and worked as a volunteer supporting students from WAMS participating backgrounds in applying for Medicine and helping at Leeds School of Medicine interviews.

During the pandemic, Alisha was a volunteer responder delivering essentials such as food and medications to local people unable to leave the house due to health and lockdown restrictions and taught A Level students university material when exams were cancelled, via zoom.

A lover of all things sporting, Alisha has been a training volunteer for Disabled Snow Sports UK 2017 – learning how to use adaptive ski and snowboard equipment for children and adults with physical disabilities.

INSPIRING YOUNG WOMEN FOUNDATION



In 2010, to mark 18 years of the Inspiring Women Awards, we set up the Inspiring Young Woman award to inspire our next generation. The Inspiring Young Woman Foundation was set up alongside to provide bursaries for the winners of this Award and to fund projects aimed at supporting our region's young women.

So far more than \pounds 17,000 has been paid out in bursaries and in 2019 we also fully funded our first external project through Warrington Youth Zone, The Pretty Tough programme, which supported 30 vulnerable young women over 6 months. During Covid, we were part of the Emergency Funds group within the Cheshire Community Foundation.

The awards lunch is our main fundraising activity to support our IYWA winners and related projects and therefore, your generous generous contributions are important to continuing this financial support.

SUSTAINABLE AWARD FOR WOMEN MAKING AN IMPACT FINALISTS

Recognising those women who are making a positive and sustainable impact, whether it's environmental, digital or educational transformation or through the circular economy or supply chain transparency.

MAIRA AZHAR



Since 2021, Maira, who has a Masters in Sustainable Development from UCL and a PGC in Sustainable Business from Cambridge, has been actively promoting cork fabric to combat the

environmental impact of both fast fashion and the leather industry. Cork leather is a carbon negative product and her handbags are all biodegradable.

Based in Chester, Maira set up 'House of Ethics' to help men and women choose vegan fashion over leather. She sells her cork based products on ETSY. The cork used in Maira's products is sourced from the bark of oak trees found in Portugal, where the leather is made by chipping off bark, boiling and shaving it into thin tissue paperlike sheets, and then laminating it into usable pieces of material.

PROFESSOR LIZ PRICE



Liz Price is Professor of Environmental Education and serves as Deputy Pro-Vice-Chancellor Sustainability at Manchester Metropolitan University. She has responsibility

for driving sustainability in every aspect of University strategy, as well as developing a sustainable mindset and skills for students and within their communities, including accelerating education for Sustainable Development Goals, Carbon Literacy and Net Zero skills.

Liz is the institutional strategic sponsor and lead for Responsible Futures and representative on the Manchester Climate Change Board and Partnership. Liz also chairs the Committee of Heads of Environmental Sciences, is a Council Member of the Institution of Environmental Sciences and a member of the Advance HE Advisory Group reviewing the Education for Sustainable Development Guidance for the UK.

Her research interests are in education for sustainable development and processes governing plant community composition.

GAYNOR THOMASSON



Gaynor founded Heelz and Toez as a business committed to disrupting the children's footwear market by enabling the manufacture of completely recyclable shoes made wholly from recycled

products. Her mission? To create shoes that are recyclable, comfortable and customisable.

The average lifespan of children's shoes is less than six months and with over 300million pairs of shoes ending up in landfill annually or being burned, Gaynor spotted a gap in the market for a sustainable product.

Her products are made of 100% recycled materials and are 100% recyclable. They are also adjustable to any foot size/shape, extending the life span of the shoe.

She survived Dragon's Den, walking away with a £50,000 investment from Touker Suleyman and in December 2022, Gaynor picked up a European Award in Sustainability.

Recognising those women or organisations who are challenging systems that don't work for women, promoting gender informed products, services or role models.

KERRY DAYNES



Kerry is a qualified forensic psychologist specialising in working with violent and sexual offenders. She began her career at the notorious HMP Wakefield, a Category A men's prison which houses

a large number of high-profile, high-risk sex offenders and murderers.

This experience has led Kerry to being recognised for her ability to engage with, and treat, complex, challenging and often dangerous patients. She is a published author and regular expert on TV true crimes programmes.

A victim herself – stabbed by a patient, stalked by a stranger, harassed by prison officers – these harrowing experiences have led her to work extensively with female victims of violence and trauma.

She challenges both the legal and mental health systems that disadvantage women and campaigns for changes in the laws around stalking and domestic violence.

CONTACT HOSTEL



The Contact Hostel was set up by former nun, Brigid Murphy, and celebrated its 50th anniversary in 2020. Brigid was concerned that too many girls were leaving education with nowhere safe to call

home. She realised that they were sometimes ending up on the streets or turning to drugs and alcohol to survive.

Whilst Brigid died in 2005, her legacy lives on, providing a safe shelter for young women aged 16-19 who are homeless or are "at high risk of being abused or exploited". They may have experienced relationship breakdowns, domestic violence, forced marriage, threatened abduction as well as physical and emotional abuse.

The Hostel, situated in Manchester, also supports young women to move on to better and happier futures with the requirement that they must be prepared to attend college, training or full-time employment.

Since 1970, the hostel has helped over 800 young women get back on their feet.

KRYSTINA PEARSON-RAMPEEAREE



Krystina is а **Chartered Aerospace** Engineer, mother, STEM Ambassador. mentor and business owner. She is passionate about careers in STEM and attracting а diverse workforce.

particularly advocating for women in engineering, where there is a lack of women in senior positions, especially women of colour.

Krystina believes that it is important to show other young women that her career trajectory (she is a Senior Flight Systems Engineer at BAE Systems on the Tempest programme) happened after becoming a mother, as research shows that there are far too many women who do not return to engineering after taking maternity leave.

In 2020, she started her own small business, AviateHer, which creates pin badges highlighting different professions in STEM, starting with a badge that says: 'This is what an engineer looks like'. She is smashing stereotypes.

HEATHER GLOVER & KATE MAURICE



Skarlette was founded by friends Heather Glover & Kate Maurice in 2021 when Heather, a nurse and twotime breast cancer survivor, and Kate, a retired pilot and passionate

seamstress, noticed a lack of flat chested lingerie. Through their supportive friendship and determination, they created a unique bra that empowers flat-chested women and cancer survivors across the world.

Skarlette was launched with just two designs, but quickly gained customers from around the globe and in 2022 they were able to grow the business and extend the product range to include two more designs and five colourways.

Products are made in Stockport, enabling local women to return to work as seamstresses, working from home, working around family commitments and working as lingerie seamstresses.

JENNIE JOHNSON MBE



In 2020, Jennie sold her business, Kids Allowed, and retired for a life of leisure. Fast forward a year and a friend sent her a video of their baby, sharing how proud they were of their little one's achievements. Jennie

was immediately struck by how many other accomplishments her baby had in this short clip and excitedly explained to her friend the long list of milestones that had just been reached.

She imagined how empowered parents would feel if they could really understand and embrace their child's unique journey of development according to their child's individuality, with scientifically backed information and in one accessible place – a next generation App. And so the My First Five Years (MFFY) App business was 'born', a personalised parenting app targeting 250,000 users in the next three years.

DELIGHT (DEE) MAPASURE




At 19 Dee arrived in England as a refugee, initially struggling to settle into a new culture and facing many incidents of racism, bias and often stereotyped as being 'one of those people'. Through a resilience

that has shaped her life since, Dee concentrated on opportunities rather than any misfortunes.

Dee is founder of K's Wors, a multi-awardwinning eclectic range of Southern African inspired Boerewors (sausages). Dee started the food brand from her kitchen table in Manchester with the help of her husband and children. It took two years of experimenting with flavours and recipes to develop K's Wors sausage into a shelf-ready product, which has been praised by BBC TV's Dragon's Den.

K's Wors is her second enterprise after establishing a successful urban cleaning company whilst working in the civil service and securing an Open University Diploma in Law.

LOUISA BLAKE



Around 2015, a s s i s t a n t Headteacher Louisa recognised that as the school holidays approached quite a few of her pupils d e m o n s t r a t e d significant mood changes and all

shared a common factor – they all had free school meals. On further investigation, she found that during the holidays their parents were struggling to feed their families and these children were going hungry.

She decided to tackle the problem head on and when the summer holidays came around, decided to help 50 families by establishing Looby Lou's Lovely Lunches.

From those first families, Looby Lou's now delivers free lunches to disadvantaged children across the Wirral during non-term time. On average, she and her team now make approximately 250 packed lunches a day throughout the main school holidays, the majority of which are delivered by Louisa herself.

Sherita established The Dimobi Children's Disability Trust in 2016, a specialist charity in Manchester which provides support for children and their families with special needs, after she realised there was

a general lack of awareness surrounding the needs of children with learning disabilities and/ or autism, specifically within different cultural backgrounds and beliefs.

In addition, cultural and religious stigmas associated with children with disabilities can preclude some parents from actively seeking professional help for their children at the earliest opportunity. This results in the marginalisation of children with disabilities, which ultimately affects their health and wellbeing in later life.

Sherita went on to achieve a degree in Social Work to better understand her two sons' disabilities and offer greater support within the charity.

Marcella founded Can-Survive UK (support and information for people with cancer) from her home in 2016 with a phone, laptop and unbounded passion to provide culturally appropriate support

to Black people and other minority communities affected by cancer.

Having been heavily involved in the end-of-life care for her father, who died from prostate cancer, she was determined to address the lack of culturally appropriate support services for Black African, Black Caribbean and other culturally diverse community members.

Can-Survive UK provides an array of services, including men and women's support groups, yoga, walking groups, creative activities (with an exhibition hosted by the Whitworth Gallery, Manchester), counselling, cancer workshops and a team of service users who raise awareness in local communities as community champions.
