DR. PARUL BARANWAL



Parul, an environmental engineer is on a mission to develop natural, cost-effective, and environmentally friendly degrading agents to remove dangerous toxins from drinking water. This work is highly relevant

for developing efficient biodegradation strategies in drinking water treatment plants.

Currently a water quality manager for the county in North Carolina, Parul is addressing significant water quality issues, particularly identifying and implementing lead and copper replacement rules for underprivileged and underrepresented communities. She is dedicated to protecting people from the effects of adverse environmental effects, such as pollution, and making our community water treatment plants more efficient and environmentally friendly.

Prior to her move to the USA, Parul served as a role model for millions of girls in India who aspire to pursue STEM education.

CAROLINE KENDE-ROBB



As a VSO volunteer, Caroline found herself living in Tanji, a small fishing village in The Gambia.

She learnt to speak Mandinka and worked hard to build trust with the community to better understand their

risks, priorities and opportunities. She attributes this experience to laying the foundations for her career, never losing sight of the goal, to bring social justice to people like those with whom she lived so closely in Tanji.

Her global career has included 16 years in Washington DC with the World Bank and IMF, working in the Sustainable Development Network, working as Executive Director of the Africa Progress Panel, working closely with its Chair and Founder, Kofi Annan, and recently as a Senior Director of Strategy and Operational Policies across the World Bank's portfolio.

DR MEDHA TADPATRIKAR



How does someone with a background (and PhD) in Branding, Marketing and Journalism find herself becoming an inventor, engineer and creating a business converting waste plastic into usable fuel?

Environmentally conscious from early age, Medha found herself working on waste plastic after witnessing the death of a deer in a wild life sanctuary, from ingesting plastic.

The passion and determination to find a solution on waste plastic resulted in Medha and her business partner Shirish Phadtare building a first pilot machine in 2010 and co-founding Rudra Environmental Solution India Ltd, now Rudra Blue Planet which currently runs 3 plants.

Medha is also concerned with educating future generations, conducting more than 1500 awareness programs, talks and seminars on Plastic Waste Management and works with the "Keshav Sita Memorial Foundation Trust" as a trustee.

Following a successful career in Financial Services, bowing out as a Director of a Legal 500 company, Jacqueline moved into consultancy setting up Olivia Henry Associates, which she still operates. She works with National and International businesses, delivering events and conferences, research projects, marketing and executing campaigns, and provides strategic advice across commercial, charity and regulatory sectors.

Whilst working in OHA and organising the Inspiring Women Awards, she was approached to join the North Wales Business School as a lecturer to create, develop and deliver a new degree course in tourism, hospitality, and events management, being promoted to senior lecturer after two years. Despite leaving HE, Jacqueline is still a visiting speaker at the Universite de Picardie Jules Verne in France, where she was recently appointed Advisory Director to the Laon International Food & Drink festival, and an External Examiner to University of Wales Trinity St David. She recently stepped down from her role at the startup qualification provider BQSL, as the Global Director of Development.

CAROLINE ROBERTS-CHERRY

Caroline is a BAFTA winning producer and a Grierson award winning director. She is the Founder and MD of Manchester based Saffron Cherry Productions, which makes Factual, Kids and Drama programmes.

Saffron Cherry also produces the Madame Blanc Mysteries, now in its third series, for Channel 5 and Acorn TV. The show was created by Saffron Cherry's creative director, the popular actor and writer Sally Lindsay (Coronation St, Mount Pleasant, Cold Call). Sally is also the lead and co-writer of The Madame Blanc Mysteries which she also exec produces alongside Caroline.

Caroline has sat on the Advisory Committee for England at Ofcom and is a long-term theatre trustee at The Royal Exchange Theatre in Manchester, Opera North and Liverpool's Everyman and Playhouse Theatres. She is a Smartworks Ambassador and has chaired the Pankhurst Trust incorporating Manchester Women's Aid since 2021.



HENRIETTA RIX

Henrietta is co-founder of RIXO, a brand loved by fashion editors, celebrities, and royals alike, with A-list fans including Daisy Ridley, Sandra Bullock and the Princess of Wales.

RIXO's story began in September 2015 in the London living room of student best friends, Henrietta Rix & Orlagh McCloskey, and was born from their passion for vintage clothing and accessories. The brand's DNA hinges around the concept of future vintage.

Within 9 years, Henrietta and Orlagh have established RIXO as a global brand. With three London stores, (the flagship King's Road opened in 2023 and houses all collections and a cocktail bar!), stocked in Harrods and the like, and even has its own community (HumansofRixo on Instagram).




LIZ TAYLOR



INSPIRING YOUNG WOMEN AWARD 2024

OLIVIA CLARKE

Ten years ago, Olivia was introduced to an organisation called RECLAIM – they had come into her school to deliver a workshop, which she just saw as an opportunity to skip PE Class.

They explained what their programmes did, but all she heard was that they'd be offering a space for her and her friends to go to during half term with free food. Unbeknown to Olivia, that day was the beginning of a decade of changemaking and would make her the activist and changemaker she is today.

Over the past ten years, Olivia has been advocating for better social mobility for working class young people, leading both regional and national campaigns, with a primary focus on the power of education reform for getting more working-class young people into leadership roles. One of her most successful campaigns has been the 'OUR Pass' – working with the Mayor of Greater Manchester, Andy Burnham, to enable free travel for 16–18-year-olds across Greater Manchester.

Alongside studying at MMU, Olivia is a Project Coordinator at an organisation called Young Manchester, facilitating the ambassador programme and responsible for a group of 15–22-year-olds – mentoring them 1-2-1.

And coming full circle, Olivia now sits on RECLAIM's board as a trustee – working to build their Youth Board to ensure youth voice is driving the organisation at all levels.

INSPIRING YOUNG WOMEN FOUNDATION



In 2010, to mark 18 years of the Inspiring Women Awards, we set up the Inspiring Young Woman award to inspire our next generation. The Inspiring Young Woman Foundation was set up alongside to provide bursaries for the winners of this Award and to fund projects aimed at supporting our region's young women.

GEMMA AITCHISON



For 10 years Gemma has fought to prevent violence against women and girls.

A single mother to a child with additional needs, Gemma's passion has taken her from a council estate in Bolton to Parliament.

After the rape and murder of her 16 year old sister Sasha Marden in 2013, Gemma discovered that Sasha's case was not an isolated one and could have been prevented. Gemma went on to found YES Matters UK which provides victim rehabilitation services to children and young people, victims of sexual assault.

Every day for 10 years she has raised awareness and worked for violence against women and girls to become a thing of the past. She doesn't believe it's inevitable and protests to change systems.

EVE CANAVAN BEM



Having suffered from postpartum psychosis 13 years ago after the birth of her son, Eve now does extensive voluntary work to support maternal mental health.

"By the time Joe was three days old, I had

decided I didn't want him. Even worse, I felt trapped by his very presence. The reality that I was now a mum forever hit me in a catastrophic way."

Getting help proved difficult, with Eve being diagnosed as 'just tired' and sent home. It took six weeks before she was eventually admitted to a psychiatric mother and baby unit. This experience propelled Eve to found the Perinatal Mental Health partnership, an organisation comprised of national charities and individuals with lived experience of mental illness after the birth of a child and is the founder of national coordinator of Maternal Mental Health Awareness Week.

GM4W0MEN



GM4Women a volunteer led organisation focused promoting equality and diversity for the benefit of the community in Greater Manchester.

Following the first viewing of the BBC film

Emmeline, The Making of a Militant, in May 2018, Helen Pankhurst, Emmeline's great granddaughter, was on the panel where the last innocent sounding question was to be the catalyst for founding GM4Women. It was a simple enough question; "what is Manchester like now for women and girls and how do we measure progress?"

Helen, a visiting Professor at Manchester Metropolitan University (MMU) initially hosted discussions with other organisations to answer these questions and bring about a call to action. A timeframe of 10 years was decided that celebrated the centenary of the first right to vote, 2018 to 2028 which is the centenary of equal franchise.



Recognising those women who are making a positive and sustainable impact, whether it's environmental, digital or educational transformation or through the circular economy or supply chain transparency.

NICOLE BROAD



In 2020, Nicole started her business, The Fruit Moth whilst shielding with Type One Diabetes. Realising that she needed an outlet for her creativity, she decided, for the first time since

completing her Fashion Design BTEC in 2011 to start sewing again.

Using her collection of vintage fabrics, she started reworking them into accessories and clothing. After a year of early morning and late night sewing whilst working her full time job Nicole made a leap of faith, quit her job and has been working on The Fruit Moth full time ever since.

Since opening her shop. Nicole has worked in collaboration with the Manchester branch of Uniqlo (the third largest clothing retailer in the world). Uniqlo sent her deadstock garments which Nicole reworked for a 70 piece collection to celebrate the launch of their in store repair service RE:Uniqlo station.

CHARLOTTE KNOWLES



Charlotte joined her husband's fledgling business, Elektec, which provides electrical services for commercial and industrial organisations, in 2019 as co-owner. As a female business

owner in the construction industry, Charlotte quickly became a role model within the profession and her creative CSR campaign led to a huge increase in brand awareness and business growth.

Elektec, was acquired by Greenarc in 2023 and Charlotte was appointed Sustainability and Social Responsibility Director, continuing her work on sustainable practices within the industry and local community.

Charlotte is also a member of the Calderdale Green Economy Team, a collaborative effort that unites businesses and community leaders in driving sustainable development and addressing the challenges of climate change.

Having transitioned Elektec into Greenarc, Charlotte is now working on her next challenge within the sustainability sector.

THE GAME CHANGERS



According to University of Manchester's fashion and textile business lecturers: Dr Amy Benstead, Dr Jo Conlon and Lindsay Pressdee, the UK disposes of one million tonnes of textiles

every year. Of this, 300,000 tonnes will end up in landfill or incineration.

Wanting to raise awareness, Amy, Jo and Lindsay set up The Game Changers project focused on tackling the often-hidden problem of sports garment waste. They work with local sportswear suppliers and the local community to transform surplus football shirts into unique reusable tote bags, while educating them of the environmental impacts of textile waste and how we can extend the life of our garments.

The project aims to provide a fun, responsible way to keep kits in circulation while shining a light on the large-scale problem in the industry.

Karen aims to draw awareness to child criminal & sexual exploitation (CSE), and educate parents, carers and members of the public, on how to keep our young people safe. Through Karen's tenacious

passion for making positive change, she has reinforced the fundamental importance of understanding our role to safeguard all young people at risk of or experiencing CSE.

No Whispers was set up four years ago with the aim of informing, educating and empowering adults about CSE through delivering training and workshops. These emphasise the importance of recognising and spotting signs, dealing with vulnerable children, early intervention and reporting to prevent children and young people from becoming victims of exploitation and abuse.

Karen has developed a specialist Level I CPD training accrediting professionals and volunteers from a range of backgrounds including Child Action NW.

"When the Ukrainian War started I wanted to do something; I felt as a Mum that I couldn't sit back and not do anything, I thought about the trauma, attachment and horrific scenes that those children

and parents had experienced and I felt that I wanted to offer any support I could."

That support started by getting supplies to the front line in Poland, then assisting over 80 people find sponsors in the area, financing their flights and completing all the visa forms.

Realising more needed to be done, Kate set out to establish a place of safety, a place of shared support, somewhere where they could express how they felt and was a constant, not a drop in, not just for practical support — so the Ukrainian Family Hub Warrington was born.
